

<p>Literacy</p> 	<p>This week in Literacy, we will be learning about instructional writing. We will begin by exploring imperative (bossy) verbs and how they are used to give commands or instructions. Working in pairs, we will practise giving clear, step-by-step instructions by explaining to each other how to make sandwiches. We will then reinforce this learning by planting seeds and writing down the instructions we follow.</p> <p>Key vocabulary: imperative verbs, nouns, verbs, chronological, order.</p>
<p>Maths</p> 	<p>This week in Maths we will be looking start looking at Multiplication and Division. Our first steps will involve us counting in 2s, 10s and 5s! We will then look at equal and unequal groups before moving on to adding these groups up with repeated addition. <p>Topic Focus:</p> <p>Science</p> 	<p>This week, we will be learning all about trees and plants. We will be building our understanding of the differences between trees and plants.
