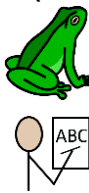
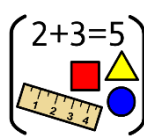

Literacy 	This week in Literacy, we are learning about rhyme. We will begin by matching up simple rhyming words, such as pin and tin, before enjoying a range of poetry and rhyming books and spotting them there. We will build on this to write our own 'Who Am I' poems as written by Moira Butterfield. Here is an example: I have blue, shiny spotty wings and each day I fly past lots of things. Who I am? Key vocabulary:
Maths 	This week in Maths, we will be learning about British money. We will be looking at coins and notes and figuring what value they hold. We will be ordering these by how much they are worth. Topic Focus:  DT	This week in DT, we are going to be looking at where food comes from. We will be learning the names and differences of root vegetables and ones that grow above ground. We will carry out market research to decide what vegetables are suitable for a summertime salad. Later in the week, we will have the opportunity to make our own salads, building on our chopping, slicing and cutting skills whilst learning all about food hygiene and the importance of health and safety too.
